THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS: WHOSE 'REAL WORLD' IS IT ANYWAY?

"You're not living in the real world." Such an accusation as this can be made when people's world views differ and where one deems another's to be implausible, not possible or unsustainable.

If I say such a thing, it can be an arrogant statement because it assumes that *my* views of the world and what is possible in the world, are advanced and sufficient and therefore, superior to *your* views.

Such an attitude may reveal that I limit what I think is possible in the world. It may mean I have accepted the status quo, stopped listening and learning and have given up on there being other possibilities.

It can also be an indication that I think some of your beliefs are too good to be true. Therefore, they cannot be true. In this case, "you're not living in the real world" can even carry a sense of envy at your belief and way of life and by contrast, dissatisfaction with my own lack of belief.

For many, the resurrection of Christ falls into this category of implausibility. It's too good to be true. The world isn't like that. The Gospel accounts suggest this was the initial reaction of Jesus' followers too; despite Jesus having spoken of it beforehand. Yet they came to believe, in one way or another, through an encounter with Jesus, that the resurrection is both good and true. As do we.

When writing about what is deemed by modern, pluralist society to be plausible; Lessie Newbigin¹ wrote that we have to see the resurrection as "a boundary event, at the point where (as cosmologists tell us) the laws of physics ceased to apply. It is the beginning of a new creation – as mysterious to human reason as the creation itself."

He also wrote; "It has never at any time been possible to fit the resurrection of Jesus into any world view except a world view of which it is the basis." ²

This is why we frequently talk of becoming Christian as 'conversion'. Whether this is a sudden or progressive process, our whole view of the world is changed when we encounter the risen Christ. We now live in and identify with a new 'Real World,' with a new set of realities and possibilities; God's new, mysterious creation. In our new Real World, death is defeated, evil is overcome, life in all its fulness is God's gift to us, should we accept the gift and live out its truth.

Christ is Risen. Make sure you encounter the Risen Christ, this Easter. It will make a whole Real World of difference.
















'I'M DREAMING OF A GREEN EASTER...'

Just last month people were astonished to see a grass fire on the coast of Merseyside. Just one sign that things are not as they should be. A reminder that all those concerned for people and planet, including followers of Jesus, should be doing much more to combat climate chaos. The floods and massive storms of late winter have also brought all this uncomfortably close to home.

Here are some ways you too can help:

- contribute to Carey's recycling of ink cartridges and pens.
- help us identify other items we could also re-cycle.
- plant an appropriate tree for the Queen's Jubilee in your garden (ensuring it is not too close to any buildings of course), or encourage a tree sapling that is already growing.
- join Extinction Rebellion protests, starting in Hyde Park on Saturday 9 April (I'm serious...).
- join the Herts & Middlesex Wildlife Trust or another nature conservancy group.
- join Carey's Green Team, to make it the 'Dream Green Team'.
- ensure your pension and other investments are not invested in the fossil fuel industry.
- contribute to the Big Give's Green Match Fund: Hope for the Future are aiming to raise £20K for a fund to encourage Christians to lobby their MPs about the environment. Any money given between 22-29 April will be matched, to double its effect. (22 April is Earth Day).
- calculate your carbon footprint. One of the easiest ways of doing this is via the World Wildlife Fund: https://footprint.wwf.org.uk

Thanks to all our efforts, this year, Carey has moved a bit closer to gaining a Silver Eco Church Award. This is thanks to Carey doing a combined Christmas card last year and due to us encouraging members to calculate their individual carbon footprint, among other things. One of the five categories, Worship & Teaching, is already at gold. Two categories, Lifestyle and Global & Community Engagement are at silver. Two categories remain at bronze level: Land and Buildings, although the latter of these is very close to turning silver, thanks partly to Carey now only using electricity from renewable sources. And there is also progress with the Land category, thanks to wildflower seeds having been sown in an area of the church garden and in the manse garden. If we are able to

make further specific steps with both Land and Buildings, it should not be long before we can rightly apply for a Silver Eco Church Award. Please ask Colin, Jon Tripp or Bhagya Leeniyagoda for details of the further steps we need to take.

Our plans and ideas for 2022 include:

- a preaching series after Easter on 'Birds & Beasties of the Bible'.
- church walks doubling up as litter-picking walks (further discussions required).
- re-visiting the lifestyle survey of November 2020 to see where we have progressed and where we still need to progress.
- arranging a Climate Sunday morning worship, perhaps combined with Belmont Road.

Thanks for playing your part in this vital aspect of our Christian calling to care for God's creation.

APPEALS FOR UKRAINE

Christian Aid

We're working with 3 partner organisations in the ACT Alliance; Hungarian Interchurch Aid (HIA) in Ukraine and Hungary, the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) in Poland, and Swiss Church Aid (HEKS) in Ukraine, Hungary and Romania, to offer assistance to internally displaced peoples and to refugees.

So far, HIA have reached 26,187 people with lifesaving aid, shelter, truckloads of food (345 metric tons), water, sanitation and health support, as well as offering vital information for refugees and internally displaced people.

Through the DEC emergency appeal, Christian Aid has donated £1 million for trauma first aid kits and £1 million for urgently needed medical and pharmaceutical equipment, items and supplies, for Ukraine, through our partner Crown Agents. Our partner is working directly with Ukraine's Ministry of Health to supply these kits to those caught up in the fighting.

BMS World Mission Oksana's story

Imagine the fear that motivated Oksana to leave her homeland. She begged her family to flee Ukraine with her. They couldn't or wouldn't come. "I am just alone here," she says. 'Here' is Poland, the country that has given her refuge.

"Towns in Ukraine are surrounded. Everyone is in fear. Everything's so horrible."

It took Oksana eight hours to reach the Polish border, but now she's here, she's safe. She doesn't know what will happen to her family or her province of Volyn Oblast. But she has a warm bed, three meals a day and the essential hygiene products she needs to feel comfortable and stay well.

For every person like Oksana who is safe, there are thousands of others fleeing the horror of war who urgently need your help. Baptist churches across Poland and other neighbouring countries are welcoming increasing numbers of refugees from Ukraine.

Through giving, you can help churches in Poland and other neighbouring countries to become safe havens for people who are frightened and fleeing for their lives. 

THIS MONTH 100 YEARS AGO

We continue our series about church life at Marlowes Baptist Church in the 1920's. This month B.T. Parris reflects, in his letter, on the arrival of spring and the world situation:

MY DEAR FRIENDS,

We have "Summer time" by Act of Parliament, but the seasons revolve under higher government, and Summer is not yet due. We are however glad that the winter lies behind us and already abundant signs of Spring surround us; the new life in nature is asserting itself and soon the earth will be clad in vesture of beauty. New movements are also stirring in human life, we are realising as never before the dignity and worth of personality and the right of every soul to self-expression. As the United States Committee report on the Church and Industrial reconstruction states "the world wide industrial unrest is not simply the rumblings of empty stomachs; it is the stirring of the soul of man, the cry for selfdevelopment in the widest sense of the term." Says S.R. Drury-Howe "there is one way out, and only one. It has never been tried before for men lack faith, and the material factor is the one that mostly appeals, yet there are many who recognise the way. "Mankind" said President Harding "needs a world wide benediction of understanding, the earth is thirsting for the cup of goodwill, and understanding is its fountain service. To quote Rear Admiral Drury-Howe again "how is it possible with the existing wide gulf between wealth and poverty.... understanding is only possible under changed conditions A National Awakening is required, a demand that our social and industrial order shall be christianised, for in that way only can understanding come, and the way to permanent peace be found." In this national awakening surely the Church of the Carpenter Prophet of Nazareth should lead, for its mission is to secure to men life "more abundant", and our Gospel has "the promise of the life which now is as well as of the life which is to come." We need a revival, a spring time in the Church, the medium through which the Christ would turn the world upside down and establish His Kingdom of Righteousness, Peace and Joy.

May we experience an incoming of new spiritual life and energy in every branch of our service,
