THE QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE

This month we celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. She is the longest reigning monarch in British history. Up until recently she attended church every week and still did a full week's work at the age of 96!

It is her commitment to serving God and the nation which stands out in her life. Even before she became Queen, she made a promise, which she has kept for over 75 years: *'I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service'* (21st birthday broadcast, 21 April 1947).

What is the secret of the Queen's consistency of character and service? In 2002 she said this: *"I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God."* These are wise words from somebody who draws her strength from the Christian Faith and can inspire all of us who want to make our lives count!

The Queen has been an example of joyful, wise, and generous service on behalf of others all her life. Six months before her coronation she asked the nation and Commonwealth to *"pray that God may give me wisdom and strength to carry out the solemn promises I shall be making, and that I may faithfully serve Him and you, all the days of my life."* Paul urges us to pray for all in authority, *"that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness."* (1 Timothy 2:2).

FIRE OF PENTECOST

"You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you and you will be witnesses to me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth" Acts 1:8

We all get tired and battle weary sometimes. The disciples of Jesus had just been through a three-year long roller coaster adventure with Jesus that had culminated in His death, resurrection and ascension into heaven.

So, what better day to pray for fresh spiritual fire for each of us? As we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and birth of the Church, let us thank God that He will never leave us or forsake us.

BAPTIST ASSEMBLY

You can find reports and recordings of the main sessions of the Baptist Assembly, held in Bournemouth on 14th and 15th May, on the BUGB website: www.baptist.org.uk Below you will find part of the report on the AGM which summarises the report of Lynn Green, General Secretary, and then a report of the new President, Hayley Young's introduction to her focus for the year – 'Building a bigger table'.

Speaking on Saturday morning, Lynn noted that it had been a tough few years with suffering and loss. Yet in the midst of it all 'we have seen and experienced the Lord at work in our churches and in our communities,' she said. 'Despite a demanding season of continual change, I have been so incredibly encouraged to see right across Baptists Together lots of prayer, adaptability, innovation and creativity. And that is the beauty of our Baptist family. We are a grassroots movement, following Jesus, engaged with our communities and willing to embrace the new opportunities that each challenge brings.'

Using a range of examples from Baptist churches and their people, she thanked God for:

- People finding faith and hope in Jesus
- for a renewed commitment to prayer across our movement
- all the ways in which His love has been demonstrated in practical ways - from the appointment of the 'incredible' Sharon Shek for the [Hong Kong project](#), to small scale projects aimed at empowering individuals and changing lives and prospects, like the [Wren Bakery](#) and prayer spaces in schools.

'Baptist churches are making a difference,' continued Lynn, 'and I want to celebrate and say a massive thank you to everyone for all the ways you are worshipping and following Jesus and joining in the mission of God in your own communities.'

Turning to the future, Lynn said we face a number of challenges, such as the ongoing uncertainty of the pandemic and global instability; and the challenge of mission. She said the changing context of our worship and mission has accelerated during the pandemic: in the face of this challenge we need to continue to prayerfully ask ourselves the question, 'What is God's call to us now?'

Finally, there is the relational challenge of 'how we hold those areas where we profoundly differ as we seek to be faithful to Christ...What I believe is key for moving forward here is that we need to give close attention to the

way in which we listen to each other in our discernment and hold the reality, and sometimes the pain, of our differences. 'God is love and so love must remain at the centre.'

Hayley Young's address

Hayley, currently the Transitional Strategic Regional Minister for the Northern Baptist Association (NBA), was inducted as the new Baptists Together President on Saturday morning (14 May).

Her focus for the year is [building a bigger table](#) - and she told Assembly this stems from the incarnation of Jesus. 'The God we worship and serve doesn't stand off to the sidelines and shout at us; He emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. He came to the mess and the confusion of the world; showing a radical hospitality to all people.' As disciples of Jesus we endeavour to follow His example, Hayley continued, 'to cross boundaries and divisions in order to listen, learn, hear, know, and respect.'

She said she is reminded of the comment: "the missionaries tried to bring us the bread of life, but we choked on the packaging."... 'Building a bigger table is about us not making that mistake: by listening to our communities, by being contextual, by respecting Christ in each other,' Hayley explained. 'Building a bigger table is about us taking the time to listen and hear from those who are not like us; who hold different views to us.'

Hayley shared her experience as a millennial female in Baptist ministry means that 'daily I interact with people who don't believe I should have a voice; with people that hold an interpretation of the Bible that means I can't exercise leadership....Every day, I enter into conversation with people who don't think I should be at the table,' she said. 'But I am still here, I still keep going, like many others, because our distinct Baptist DNA compels us to listen, learn, hear, know and respect – even in difference.'

Quoting Paul in 1 Corinthians 9, she asked, 'Can we, as a Baptist Movement, build a bigger table for the sake of the gospel?' It will be 'difficult at times.. but I believe it will bring blessings and joy as well,' Hayley said.

She added, 'I accept that some may have switched off when I stood up here, some may choose not to listen. I accept that you may not want to

hear from me because of my age, gender, or perceived theology – but I would really like you to know, that I would love to hear from you.

'Let's connect over this year: Will you build a bigger table by joining the conversation?'

NEW TRANSLATIONS OF THE BIBLE

Scripture translations completed for 10 per cent of the world's population in 2021

Bible Societies across the world completed Scripture translations in 90 languages last year used by 794 million people – just over 10 per cent of the world’s population.

Despite a second year of disruption caused by Covid, 48 language groups – a total of 11 million people – received first Scripture translations, meaning that they were not previously available in those languages.

New or revised translations were completed in languages used by 783 million people. These provide Scripture access to language communities whose needs are no longer met by previous translations.

Meanwhile, work is progressing on the translation of Scriptures in countries including Burkina Faso, Eritrea, Eswatini, Gabon, Mali, Nigeria, The Gambia and Togo.

Thanks to the efforts of Bible Societies and other Bible translation agencies, at the start of 2022 the full Bible is available in 719 languages, spoken by 5.8 billion people. Around 70 per cent of these were translated by Bible Societies.

Yet, more than half of the world’s languages, used by 219 million people, still have NO Scripture translations at all. And 1.5 billion people do not have the full Bible in their heart language.

Bible Society hopes to complete 1,200 Scripture translations by 2038. Of those, 880 will be first translations, and another 320 are new or revised translations.

OUT AND ABOUT ON THE ROADS?

Out and about on the roads? Remember the NEW Highway Code

When did you last read the Highway Code? Various ‘fundamental’ changes were recently made which will surely affect you.

For example, there is a new hierarchy of road users, where drivers now have new responsibilities to watch out for people who are walking, cycling, or riding a horse.

Another example is that cyclists are now advised to cycle in the *centre* of lanes in slower-moving traffic.

Finally, do you even know how best to open your car door? According to the Highway Code, you should use your hand on the opposite side to the door you are opening; for example, use your left hand to open a door on your right-hand side. This will make you turn your head to look over your shoulder. You are then more likely to avoid causing injury to cyclists or motorcyclists passing you on the road, or to people on the pavement.
